SECTION 14. VACANCIES:

Where a vacancy in any elective office shall occur, except a vacancy created as a result of conditions contained in Section 13, the vacant office shall be filled by a unanimous vote of the remaining Mayor and/or City Council members for the unexpired term. In the event that a unanimous vote cannot be obtained within 30 days from the date of the vacancy, the vacant office shall be filled by a special election for the remainder of the unexpired term in the same manner as provided in this charter for the regular election of such offices. Such election shall be held on the first uniform election date under state law, no sooner than 30 days after ordering the election; provided however, that where a vacancy occurs within 90 days of the normal expiration date of the office, no special election to fill the vacancy shall be called unless more than two vacancies occur. SECTION 14. VACANCIES:
